

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
Welcome to Extended Constructed Response Text Sets for Texas.

An American Hero

- In 1962, John Glenn became the first American to fly a spacecraft around the Earth. He set the course for space exploration.
- On February 20, 1962, John Glenn lifted off from Cape Canaveral, Florida. His mission was to fly a spacecraft around the Earth. No American had done it before. Glenn orbited Earth three times. Then he landed in the Atlantic Ocean. He was an instant hero.
- At the time, the U.S. was racing the former Soviet Union to send humans into space. The Soviets won. But Glenn helped the U.S. catch up quickly on the new frontier.
- "It was one of the crucial first steps toward landing astronauts on the moon," Michael Cabbage told TFK. Cabbage works for NASA.

Someone to Look Up To

- for many years. He was a U.S. senator from Ohio for 24 years. In 1998, he made history again. He became the oldest person ever to travel into space. Glenn died in 2016 at the age of 95.
- Glenn once lived in New Concord, Ohio. "It's cool to grow up in the same town as an American hero," says Taelor, a third grader there. "It makes me want to do great things."
